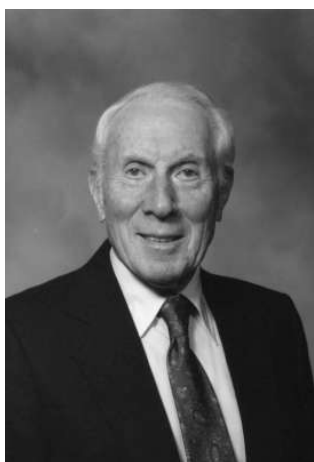
Henry S. said that he is making remote controlled digital cameras designed for model aircraft use. If interested, please contact Henry for details.

Charles E. Edgar

March 2, 1915 - August 29, 2009

Charlie was born in Philadelphia and lived most of his childhood in the Moorestown, N.J. area. His father ran an auto garage and Charlie acquired an early interest in tinkering with engines. Combined with his interest in aviation, gas powered model planes was a natural.



There were lots of wide open spaces in South Jersey at that time for flying the free flight models of the day.

He married, moved to Harrisburg where he was employed as regional credit manager for Pierce-Phelps, a wholesale appliance distributor. He retired after forty-four years of service. He was very active in his church and sang in the choir for sixty-two years.

Charlie came back to the hobby late in life after receiving a Hidden Hanger gift certificate for his birthday. During the nine years he has been a club member, Charlie built a 42" Cherokee, two 70" trainers, and a beautifully finished Anniversary Edition 76" Piper Cub.

Charlie died seven weeks after suffering a serious stroke. He is survived by four children, ten grandchildren, five great-grandchildren, and two brothers.

Charlie was a stickler for parliamentary decorum which helped in keeping our meetings under control.
