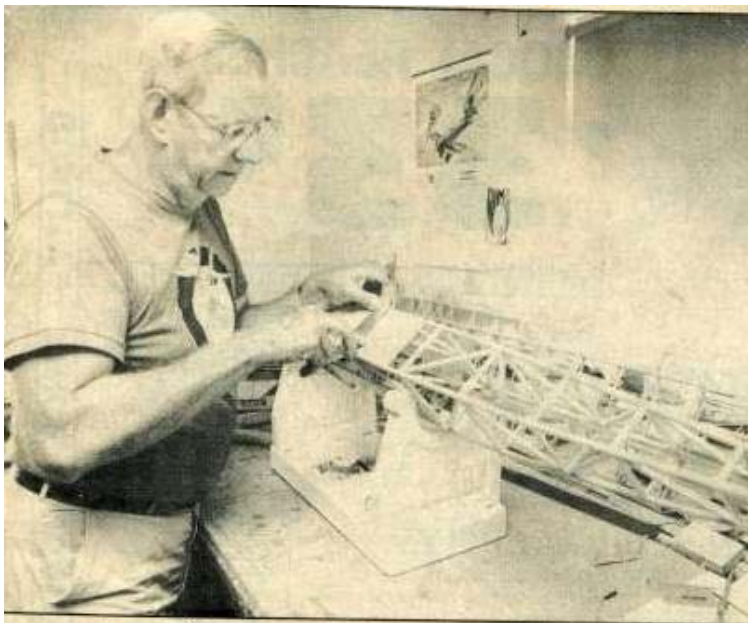
Beginings
